German Roach Treatments

The average German roach treatment takes a MINIMUM of 3 services over a six week span (once every two weeks). We recommend you not change or miss the scheduled day of service. Missing a scheduled service may result in missing a hatching cycle. If a hatching cycle is missed than the treatment may need to restart.

Preparing For Your German Roach Treatment

Proper preparation is an essential step for ensuring the most effective results for your upcoming German roach treatments. The following detailed instructions are necessary before your scheduled treatment. Preparation involves everything from providing adequate access to your unit or property, to cleaning and post-treatment recommendations. We recognize that appropriate preparation can be difficult to achieve in a short period of time and that senior citizens or handicapped individuals may need additional assistance and time considerations.

PLEASE NOTE: Ameriguard Exterminating will not provide treatment to any unit or property that has not met the preparations that follow in this instructional document.

Items Recommended for Preparation

- 1. Plastic Storage Bins
- 2. Dollar Store Cabinet Liner

*Ameriguard Exterminating recommends using generic products in order to save on cost.
Additional items may be necessary.

Proper German Roach Preparation

First Service Only: Clean kitchen thoroughly, including floors and countertops. All cleaning should be done before the treatment, NOT after.

- 1. Everything should be removed from kitchen cupboards, above the fridge, kitchen pantries, and dishwashers, above, below and within the sink, drawers, and countertops. Items may be placed on the kitchen table, a couch or chair and covered with a sheet.
- 2. Bathroom cabinets and beneath the sink should be cleaned out.
- 3. Pick up and remove trash from the floor.
- 4. Pets should be removed from inside. Fish tanks should be covered with a sheets and the air pump shut off.
- 5. Children's toys, pet food dishes, and exposed food should be placed in a protected area.
- 6. Cabinets, counters, and floors in the kitchen and bathrooms should be cleared at time of service.

After Treatment is Complete

- Don't re-enter the premise for at least 4 hours unless specifies otherwise. If you have medical problems or are sensitive to odors, it may be advisable to stay out longer. Consult your physician.
- Immediately upon re-entering the treated premises, open windows and doors to air thouroughly.

- 3. Thourghly wash (with soap and water) all exposed eating services (including table and countertops) and any exposed dighes or silverware. DO NOT wash any treated surfaces such as baseboards and cupboards. Place down the tack paper or newspaper if you choose to place things back in the cupboards. Although it is recommended to store things in plastic storage bins until the completeion of the services.
- 4. In roach control, sanitation is essential. DO NOT leave empty milk or beverage bottles inside. Keep areas under and behind stoves and refridgerators clean. DO NOT allow food and garbage to accumulate in areas where roaches feed or hide. Pet food should be stored in sealed containers.
- It is normal to see roaches for several days after the treatment. It may take roaches hiding in inaccesible areas to contact treated areas. In 2 weeks, your house or apartment should be retreated.
